Level 2 End-point Assessment for Baker AP04

Knowledge Test (KT)

- The knowledge test assesses the underpinning knowledge and understanding of the apprentice across all knowledge statements within the standard
- There will be **60 multiple choice questions: 40 questions** on core knowledge and **20 questions** on knowledge relating to one option, as appropriate to the apprentice's workplace: craft,

90 minutes are allowed to complete the test.

The KT will be graded fail, pass, merit or distinction.

The KT carries a weighting of 20% within the overall apprenticeship grade.

Assessment Centre Observation (ACO)

The independent examiner will assess the apprentices' competence at undertaking the following core skill:

• Produce a loaf of bread by hand with no mechanical aids – using only flour, salt, water and yeast

The apprentice will also be assessed on one of the following three core skills during the ACO. They will not have prior knowledge on which of these three will be assessed.

- Produce a cake/sponge product to specification using the manual or mechanical processes
- Produce a pastry product to specification, using the manual or mechanical process including sweet or savoury
- Produce an enriched dough to specification, using the manual or mechanical process

The apprentice will have a maximum period of one day, **up to 7 hours**, to complete both activities in the test.

The ACO will be graded fail, pass, merit or distinction.

The ACO carries a weighting of 35% within the overall apprenticeship grade.

Workplace Observation and Interview (WOI)

The following activities will be assessed in the workplace observation. The apprentice will be assessed on adhering to hygiene, health and standards and maintaining the work environment both during the activities and at the end of the observation.

- Craft Skills OR in-store skills OR automated skills
- Core Skills
- Core Knowledge
- Behaviours

The workplace observation and interview will be between 6 to 8 hours, depending on the pathway.

The interview will be no longer than 45 minutes within this period.

Each element is scored according to the assessment criteria.

Craft Skills Observation	80 points
Core Skills, Knowledge and Behaviours	120 points

The craft, in-store / automated and Core skills, knowledge and behaviours will be assessed as being either acceptable or outstanding.

The workplace observation and interview carries a weighting of 45% within the overall apprenticeship grade.

<u>Level 2 End-point Assessment for Baker AP05</u>

End-point Assessment method 1: Observation with questions (OQ)

The following activities will be assessed in the observation. The apprentice will be assessed on adhering to hygiene, health and safety standards and maintaining the work environment both during the activities and at the end of the observation.

The observation should be conducted in the following way, to take account of the occupational context in which the apprentice operates.

- Tasks related to craft baker duties
- Tasks related to plant baker duties
- Tasks related to retail baker duties

The apprentice will be asked to complete 8 activities. Tasks are not listed in any particular

OQ Questioning session

A minimum of 6 open questions will be asked.

Questions will be taken from FDQ's OQ item bank. Questions may be asked during the observation (in natural stops between tasks) and at the end of the observation. The IE will remain as unobtrusive as possible during the observation.

The OQ will be graded fail, pass, merit or distinction.

The OQ will be 4.5 hours, +10% as required, (5 hours maximum), to include time for questioning. The observation will take place in one continuous session, allowing comfort breaks as necessary.

End-point Assessment method 2: Interview underpinned by portfolio of evidence (IN)

The Interview underpinned by portfolio of evidence involves the IE asking the apprentice a series of questions to assess competence against the KSBs that do not occur on a predictable or regular basis. Questions will be open and competence-based, with additional follow up questions for clarity.

The questions will be a combination of standardised questions from FDQ's IN question bank and questions devised by the IE, based on the portfolio of evidence.

A minimum of 8 questions will be asked, at least one for each of the 8 following topics:

The IN will be graded fail or pass.

The IN will last for 45 minutes + 10% as required, maximum 50 minutes.

End-point Assessment method 3: Multiple-choice Test (MCT)

- Knowledge Test assesses the underpinning knowledge and understanding of the apprentice through 40 multiple-choice questions, one point is allocated to each question.
- There will be 36 questions on core knowledge and 4 questions on knowledge relating to craft bakery.

The MCT will be graded fail or pass.

The MCQ allows 60 minutes to complete the test.

Main Differences

- Knowledge Test (KT) AP04 60 questions, 90 minutes (pass, fail, merit, distinction)
- Multiple-choice Test (MCT) AP05 40 questions, 60 minutes (pass, fail)
- Assessment Centre Observation (ACO) AP04 up to 7 hours (pass, fail, merit, distinction)
- End-point Assessment method 1: Observation with questions (OQ) AP05 will last for 4.5 hours, +10% as required, (5 hours maximum), (pass, fail, merit, distinction)
- Workplace Observation and Interview (WOI) AP04, up to 8 hours (pass, fail, merit, distinction)

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
